


What is your stance on the McKinney ISD bond measures on the ballot and why?

(Community Impact) When elected, the issues paramount in the district is the ECD Pass Rating (Economically Disadvantaged Children) chart of schools in Collin County. 2019 information indicates our district ranks 13th out of 14 (Lovejoy is first and Anna is fourteenth). Keeping quality teachers and substitutes within McKinney ISD rather than taking experience and talent to other districts because of better salaries. The lack of proper diversity throughout the entire district.

What is your stance on the McKinney ISD bond measures on the ballot and why?


I'm in support of the anti-discrimination/bullying policies for the simple reason of the make-up of an individual should not effect the receive equal opportunity to education




What is your stance on the McKinney ISD bond measures on the ballot and why?


Platform/Priorities - Continued

Dual Language Programs - I love strong dual and tri-language programs but they should be open to home English speakers as well as students who are just learning English. I have seen many of these programs do very well and some not do so well. Wither we are dealing with ESL or dual language the issue is proficiency in the academic language. This is very critical for our English learners who need to master the academic language in a very accelerated pace. This focus helps increase over all district performance and decrease drop out rates.

What is your stance on the McKinney ISD bond measures on the ballot and why?

CG: I am worried about the amount we are spending on AC systems all at once. I haven't been able to find anyone in the community that was on the bond committee, which suggests that this is being driven by the administration without the input of the community. We will be spending \$35 million on a new elementary school while we have already purchased the land and poured the pad. It seems to be at least \$15 million more expensive than it should be. I would like to see a breakdown and reasoning for the line items, including the STEM items. 1,000 kids have withdrawn from McKinney ISD. That's a large population decrease. Why are we rushing this bond issue?

I do not support this change because the current policy in McKinney ISD is that ALL students and employees be free from bullying. Since the language already is inclusive of all, providing examples of specific types of bullying would only run the risk of emphasizing certain types over others, and could cause some groups to feel excluded, which is contrary to the goal. I believe the policy, by stating "all students," adequately covers each instance.



What would you, as a School Board Member, do to educate yourself about the diverse community you serve, including the LGBTQ community? Do you consider it a priority to ensure that District employees receive diversity training which includes information regarding issues facing LGBTQ youth?

As a new School Board Member, I would make it a priority to understand the culture of each of McKinney's 30 schools and learn more about each affinity group that is active on campus. Doing this could include visiting the schools, learning about the clubs and associations, observing their activities, participating in service projects, and potentially attending their membership meetings. Because I am not yet a Board member, I am not familiar with the current diversity training content for employees, and therefore cannot comment on what it includes or excludes, how frequently it is delivered, and how it is evaluated. I commit to learning about that quickly after the election and would examine it closely.

Why should members of the LGBTQ community support your candidacy?

I am a leader who listens and learns, and I favor a more transparent and accountable system of Board governance. For example, I speak often about the need to develop a catalogue of all district programs—who they are serving, who might be left out, and what we know about the program's effectiveness. I have also spoken frequently about my desire to improve our district's strategic plan so we can establish baselines and reliable metrics to show where we are and where we want to go. Further, I have strongly emphasized community engagement so the Board can invest in measures to better understand the concerns, interests, needs, and experiences of our district's students, parents, teachers, and staff. I would be a representative voice that always seeks to measure, and where necessary improve upon, our programs and policies.
