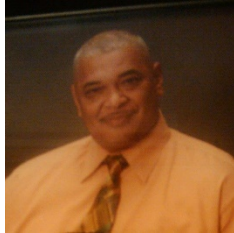

Advocating for the immediate and long-term allocation of coronavirus vaccines for our residents through federal and state agencies will be essential in providing means to keep us safe and healthy. As your next city councilwoman, I would like to utilize my clinical experience to help navigate McKinney through the next few years as we continue to battle this pandemic and any variants of COVID that arise. I will also collaborate with our public safety officials to find how to best address the growing mental health needs of our community.

Attainable Housing - McKinney is a wonderful place to live and raise a family. But like many other cities in the U.S, McKinney is facing an attainable housing crisis, lacking the inventory in a variety of housing options that meet the needs of its current and incoming residents.
